## Literacy

### Recounts

Yesterday you wrote a recount about one of your snow days last week.

Today I would like you to write another recount.

What you need to do is interview the adult who is looking after you today, ask them about a little story that happened to them when they were a child. Try to find out the details by asking lots of question about the incident.

After you have interviewed them write a recount of that story.

Remember:

Include lots of details

Chronoloical (time) order.

Start each sentence with different time connectives.

Write it in the 3rd person.

If you have a computer that you can type on then use it to do your writing. If not any sort of paper and pen/pencil will do, no excuses!

## Maths

Using a dice (and if you can't find a dice just make up some numbers) generate some multiplications for yourself.

If you usually do year 5 work you need to do:

15 one digit x two digit number calculations. (e.g.  $6 \times 34 =$ )

So that's 15 calcuatlions written out on a piece of paper

If you normally do year 6 work then do:

5 one digit x two digit calculations (e.g.  $6 \times 23$ )

5 one digit x three digit (  $6 \times 324$ )

5 one digit x decimals point numbers (  $6 \times 32.4$ )

Again that's 15 calculations in total written out of a piece of paper.

Please try to use the bracket method that we used on Monday and Tuesday.

$$(6 \times 20) + (6 \times 3) = 120 + 18 = 138$$

## History

Try to find out the answers to the following questions. Again write your answers on a piece of paper.

1. What was the name given to the bombing of London and other UK cities?
2. What was rationing and how much butter was a person allowed each week?
3. Which countries were Great Britian's allies during the war?
